Please remember to **WEAR** your **name badges** so that we can all get to know you.



PROFESSOR GEORGE BURNS

This month's guest speaker was Professor George Burns, talking on the subject of nature-based therapy. He pointed out the benefits of spending time in nature, for our mental and physical health, and how this translates into



He tries driving the car at night for a week but no joy.




Angry paddy replies, "Of course, I'm not that feckin stupid, I use D for the Day and N for the Night...
