

Guest Speakers for August

Kate and Sally

Kate and Sally are from the WA Country Health Service, and were here filling us in on the transition from the state and federally funded Home and Community Care service (HACC), to the federally funded Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP).

Sally informed us of the changes and how they may affect us. From July 1, 2018, WA has joined CHSP. It is expected that this change will provide a continuity of care but with a greater choice of providers.

The Regional Assessment Service is now assessing people's eligibility for services. The website myagedcare.gov.au will give you the information you need regarding care, but it is in its early stages and can be hard to navigate.

Be aware that if you change from an existing package, the "grandfather clause" drops out and you may get less funding.

When you are setting up a package with a care broker, be wary of possible fees for administration.

Kate gave us a rundown of some of the services available to us at the Denmark Health Service. Her team provides stroke rehabilitation, falls prevention and related services.

Sally and Kate had a lot of information to get across. They told us that they would be happy to come back and speak to us again if we need them to.

It was a valuable information session and gave us an insight into the valuable services that we can access when we need to.
