January's guest speaker was our own travel guru, **Carmel Stott**, talking about her recent trip to the Papua New Guinea Highlands. Although it was only a week long, her trip to see the Goroka Festival was an action packed feast of culture.

The people of the eastern highlands are a creative lot, with strikingly colourful costumes and body paint, and some intricate masks and head dresses. Carmel showed us footage of the Asaro Mudmen, who, back in their history, lost their village to an enemy tribe and went and hid down by the river. They covered themselves with white clay so that their invaders thought they were ghosts and ran away. They now reenact this saga, covered in white body paint and wearing huge clay masks. It is quite a scary sight.

Another interesting cultural feature of the area was the dressing of children as dwarfs, with shaved bald pates and glued on facial hair. They look like midget adults, which their families believe will bring them good fortune.

Papua New Guinea is renowned as being a dangerous place, but Carmel said that the people were very friendly and hospitable. The only exception to this was a couple of small instances of pickpocketing. Certainly from the slideshow, they came across as enthusiastic hosts to their small group of guests. I am sure that there will be a few of us that will be adding PNG to our travel bucket list after this enlightening talk.
