#### January Guest Speaker

This month's guest speaker was Simon Clark, giving us some useful tips on taming your passwords.

I am by no means a tech-head, but I will do my best to give you the gist of it.

When you get a new computer, you get a new username and password. To avoid forgetting it later, have a system. You could write it down in a book. Alternatively you could have a spreadsheet with all your passwords on it. You can put a "master password" into your spreadsheet.

Should you use the same password for everything? Not a good idea, as you can potentially be "breached" in more than one place. The longer a password is, the better. If anything suspicious happens, change your password.

Your primary email account password is vital, as is your Mygov password. One good strategy is to remember a simple rule and vary it. For example, "Simple 123!" with additional characters at the end to differentiate your various passwords.

To authenticate your identity you need to know your password and username and also give a phone number as an additional level of security. The six-digit code sent to your phone "evaporates" after 15 minutes, so does not need to be recorded.

How much do you back up? Simon suggests important documents and emails should be backed up. You can back up on the "cloud", an external hard drive available from the Post Office for around \$100, or a thumb drive. There is free software available to do backups.

Security questions can be a problem to remember too, so write them down.
