Guest Speaker

This month's guest speaker was Lee Shelley, a captain of one of our local volunteer fire and rescue groups, talking about his deployment as a volunteer in Canada's bushfires last July. 220,000 hectares of the country was on fire that summer.

Lee made a very interesting point when comparing firefighting in Australia and Canada. Australia has easy access but limited water, while Canada has plenty of water but limited access. This defines the way fires are fought in both countries.

Lee was deployed to a first nations community in Thunder Bay, Ontario, where they evacuated the



householders and installed sprinklers on the roof of every house. The firefighters had to carry heavy hoses and pumps through dense forest to the lake and pump the water to the community.

They had problems with dogs, which seemingly outnumbered people in the community, and which were left behind in the evacuation. They needed to be fed so that they didn't cause problems for the firefighters.

Lee was also involved in making 30 kilometres of firebreak through pristine forest, which was not a universally popular move.

Another of his tasks was to retrieve the pumps and sprinklers from the lake, which was heavy and difficult work.

In the midst of his deployment, Lee tested positive for Covid and had to isolate for ten days in a two-storey lodge where he got a taste for Canadian beer. A tough job but somebody has to do it!

He commented that the Canadian firefighters are a paid workforce, unlike the Australian firefighting teams, many of whom are volunteers. Much of the work is done by university students on their summer break.

He also noted that the Canadian firefighting was more high-tech. Supplies and infrastructure, such as accommodation, are brought in by semitrailers; and much of the firefighting is done by helicopters and planes.

When asked if he would go back to Canada again, he was quick to say that he would. That suggests that it wasn't all hard work, but much appreciated by the Canadians, I'm sure.
