JULY GUEST SPEAKER, PAT GILL FROM THE DENMARK BULLETIN

Pat grew up on a farm on the Liverpool Plains, New South Wales, with no TV or radio but lots of reading matter in the form of magazines and books. Then the family moved to another farm east of Esperance in Western Australia. Whilst still a teenager, she married a farm manager and by her mid-twenties, had school aged children.



She had no qualifications but when her mother

suggested that she could write for a local publication, she applied for a job with the Western Farmer newspaper. She got the job and proceeded to write about new developments in farming. From there she moved to the Great Southern Herald. She obviously showed ability, as she was offered a journalism cadetship in Albany, which she entered at a four-year trained level.

Some notable events in her career included winning a national award in rural journalism and her involvement in the Royal Commission into sexual abuse by Dennis McKenna at St Andrews Hostel in Katanning.

She became sub-editor in Albany, where she was responsible for the publication of nine newspapers, from Broome to Albany. There she married her boss, Andrew Gill. When Eileen Lunan decided to retire and sell the Denmark Bulletin, Pat took on our local paper. She developed it from the small black and white publication to the coloured broadsheet that we know today. Now it has an online platform, but people still want a physical copy.

The newspaper is delivered to every letterbox and is available from Morrisons and from various locations around the town.

She was a lively and entertaining speaker, keeping us interested with plenty of funny anecdotes and slides which included some of our Probus members.


